




A selection of books especially selected for children in Year 5.


If your child is a very competent reader or has read all of these titles, then try the books from the Year 6 list.


The Lion Above the Door






Everything You Know About Dinosaurs is Wrong!




The Boy Who Made Everyone Laugh




When Secrets Set Sail






Talking to the Moon



The story is beautifully told, as much about Iris and her search for orderand happiness as it is about Mimi and her struggle with dementia. A poignant, thoughtful examination of family relationships, memory and loss, that ends on a note of hope and renewal.




High-Rise Mystery






Varjak Paw






Shackleton's Journey


