




A selection of books especially selected for children in Year 6.



Author: Nick Lake Release Date: 04/08/2022








Spark




The Hideaway






Utterly Dark and the Face of the Deep



Me, My Dad and the End of the Rainbow




The Weight of Water






The Eleventh Trade










Beetle Boy






Journey to the River Sea
