




# A selection of books especially selected for children in Year 2.


If your child is a very competent reader or has read all of these titles, then try the books from the Year 3 list.

Author: Joseph Coelho Release Date: 10/05/2022




#### You Can!






## A Cat Called Waverley

Author: Debi Gliori Release Date: 12/08/2021






# Nano: The Spectacular Science of the Very (Very) Small

#### The Invisible



Author: Emily Gravett Release Date: 15/10/2020




# Clean Up!






## Tibble and Grandpa

Author: Wendy Meddour Release Date: 21/05/2020








# The Wolf, the Duck and the Mouse

Author: Mac Barnett Release Date: 04/10/2018






#### Here We Are






# Claude Going for Gold!
